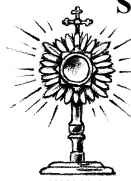

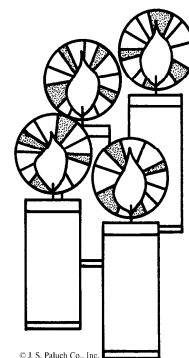

DIOCESAN EVENTS/NEWS**SUPPORT THE LETTER CARRIER FOOD DRIVE**

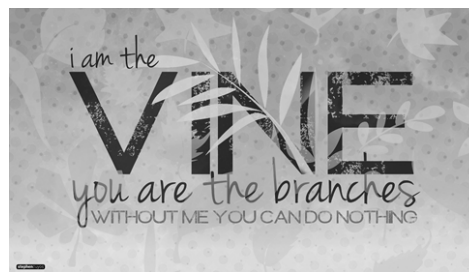

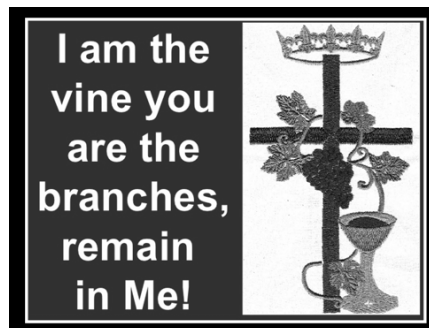
