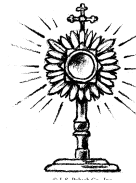

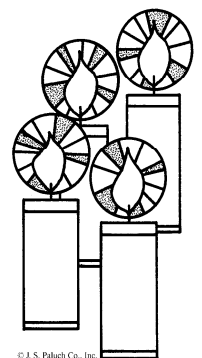

STEWARDSHIP NOTE

“Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not.” (EXODUS

16:4) When the Israelites gathered more than their daily portion of manna, the surplus became wormy and rotten. In the same way today, self-reliance, pride and ego leads to hoarding and excessive surplus of goods and money. Living a stewardship lifestyle helps us discern our “wants” from our “needs.” Living a generous lifestyle reminds us that God will provide all that we need and that we have plenty to share.

EARLY REGISTRATION FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Registration for Religious Ed classes for the upcoming year 2018-2019 are now open. If for some reason you did not receive an email with the registration sheets attached or you don’t have access to a printer to print out and return the forms, there are blank copies available at both entrances to the church. Please take advantage of this early registration so we have an idea of how many books/supplies to order and start this year off on the right foot. Classes start Sept. 9th.

STRATEGIC INITIATIVE UPDATE

With a year and a half to go in our parish's Strategic Initiative and with the celebrations of our 150th anniversary fast approaching, the following is an update on how capital campaign funds have been and continue to be used.

Projects that Have Been Accomplished:

- Insulated the Our Lady of Guadalupe Chapel ceiling.
- Insulated the main church ceiling.
- Installed a high efficiency gas fired heating system in the main church.
- Installed a high efficiency gas fired heating system in the Our Lady of Guadalupe Chapel.
- Restored the Steeple and the two nearby pillar caps. These included necessary repairs to the cross atop the belfry (steeple), as well as the gilding of the three crosses.
- Installed a parish sign on Main Street.
- Completed an emergency installation of a heating system for downspouts and gutters on the parish hall and gym building, in the wake of dangerous ice buildup & water damage.
- The remaining balance of the parish hall and gym building was paid.
- Previous parish operational debt was paid.
- Three years running, covered operational expenses remaining at the end of the fiscal year in order to maintain the parish's debt free status.

Previously Outlined Projects Still in Progress:

- Restoration of most of the largest stained glass windows in the church. This project includes a new outer layer of protective glass, as well as new window openings that replace the inoperative original ones.
- We are currently waiting for National Grid to install a gas supply line to the rectory, in preparation for installation of a high efficiency water heating system.

Strategic Initiative Prioritized Projects Not Yet Completed:

- The installation in the rear of the church of bathroom facilities accessible by those with mobility issues.
- The replacing of the deteriorated grouting between the stone blocks comprising the outer facade of the church, a common practice called "pointing."

Thank you again for your wonderful example of Christian stewardship in giving to the Strategic Initiative.
Your ongoing commitment is yet another sign of God's blessings to us.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

During the time of communist reign in many countries in Eastern Europe, practicing the Catholic faith was illegal, church buildings were confiscated, and people were forced to hide and secretly share the truths of the Gospel. Having survived decades of institutional oppression and persecution, Catholics still struggle to rebuild not only their physical places of worship but also their church ministries and communities. "Restore the Church - Build the Future" is the national theme for the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe (CCEE) which will be taken up in our diocese on the weekend of August 12. Grants funded by this national collection support pastoral projects, scholarships, and Catholic organizations working in areas formerly under Soviet control.

The emerging problems posed by secularism also require major investments in developing the next generation of Church leaders. The country of Albania is nestled north of Greece on the Adriatic Sea. This small country suffered greatly under communist rule. In the capital of Tirana, located in the middle of the country, the Church is continuing to restore not only its structures but also the spirituality of the faithful after years of oppression. For example, in 1996, the congregation of sisters known as the Company of Mary Our Lady founded a kindergarten, the first Catholic school in the entire capital city. Since then, they have opened a school for grades 1-9 and a daily activity center for children. The sisters are now serving over 700 children daily from all different backgrounds, faiths, and ethnic groups. With your support of CCEE, these sisters will be able to make critical repairs to their building to continue their ministry. Your generosity helps the sisters to continue teaching children and equips the congregation to provide a space to build peaceful communities.

In order for projects like this one to continue, the collection needs your help. I ask that you keep these programs in your prayers and that we join our fellow Catholics in the United States in making a generous contribution to support the efforts to rebuild pastoral capacity and create future leaders of the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe.
