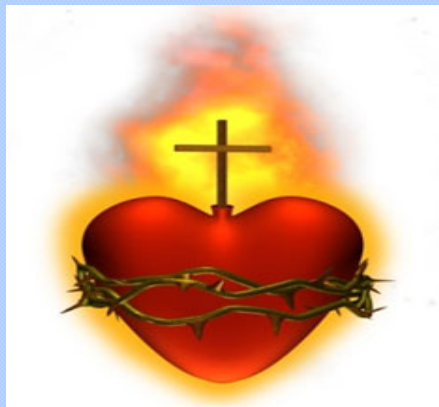

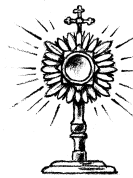
FROM THE BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL

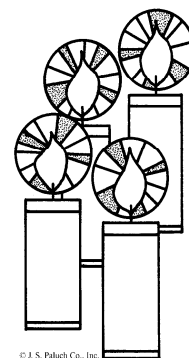

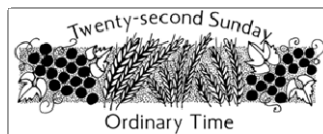

**THE IMPORTANCE OF VOTING IN THE PRIMARY ELECTION ON SEPTEMBER 4TH****QUOTE FROM POPE BENEDICT**

“It is the duty of the laity to participate actively in political life.....for lay faithful to bear witness to Christ and the Gospel in the civil and political community”.

Do we view voting in the same way as founding father Samuel Adams did? As a solemn trust in human society – a decision of which we are each accountable to God and to our communities and our nation?

We have in large part wrongly lumped voting with politics. But here's the truth, **the act of voting is not political, it is our sacred responsibility.**

The framework of our political system provides the greatest opportunity to select Godly leaders in primary elections. Yet, it's at this critical phase of the election process - primary elections - that so many Christians neglect to vote, either because of apathy or busy schedules.
