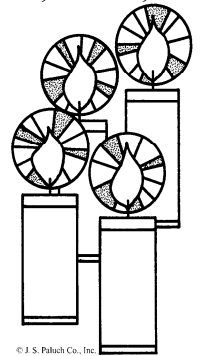

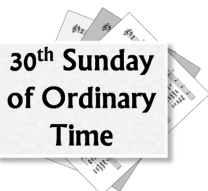

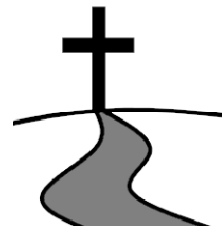

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ

At the beginning of the month of October, 2018, Pope Francis stated the following in light of the contentious and pastorally troubling atmosphere that has engulfed the Church not only in the United States but globally as a result of the new wave in the sexual abuse crisis: "This is our power: not to dominate or to cry out more loudly, according to the logic of the world, but rather to exercise the gentle power of prayer."

As a response to the Holy Father's wise and spiritually compelling pastoral direction, I am asking that in every parish in the Diocese of Worcester that the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel be recited by the faithful attending Mass. The prayer should be led by the celebrant of the Mass or the deacon who may be exercising his liturgical role at Mass, after the Prayer after Communion and before the Final Blessing and dismissal.

The text of the prayer which the Church has prayed in turbulent times since it was composed by Pope Leo XIII in 1886 is as follows:

#### PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

*St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray. and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen. "*
